**S**aint Mary Parish was founded, under the patronage of Mary, Help of Christians, in the Year of Our Lord 1885. The cornerstone of the second and current church was laid on July 4, 1898, with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass celebrated in it for the first time the following year. It was solemnly Consecrated according to the Roman Pontifical on June 18, 1907 by the 2nd Bishop of Sioux Falls, the Most Reverend Thomas O'Gorman. It was placed on the National Registry of Historic Places in 1985, the Centennial Year of the founding of the parish. On July 4, 2010, the parish celebrated its Quasiquintennial.

## REMEMBER: WE TURN TOWARDS GOD

PRIEST & PEOPLE PRAYING TOGETHER AT THE EUCHARIST

Until Mass celebrated *ad orientem* (priest & people facing the altar together) is revived in the Western Church, worship will be permanently distorted and diminished. What staggers me is the way that many reduce the argument for celebrating 'facing the people' to purely personal terms. When the eastward position (facing 'liturgical east') is used the complaint is usually 'He is turning his back on us.' The principle of objective worship appears to have disappeared in place of pure subjectivity. Although there are good arguments for both positions, those for *ad orientem* are more ancient and convincing.

The deciding issue concerning the position of the priest at the altar is, as we have said, the nature of the Mass as a sacrificial offering. The person who is doing the offering is facing the one who is receiving the offering; thus, he stands before the altar, positioned *ad Dominum*, facing the Lord.

If, nowadays, the aim is to emphasize the aspect of the communal meal during the "Eucharistic Feast" by celebrating *versus populum* (facing the people), this aim is not being met, at least not in the way some might have hoped. The new arrangement has the "meal leader" positioned at the table, by himself. The other "meal participants" are situated in the nave, or in the "auditorium," not directly connected to the "meal table." ...

The focus must forever be on God, not man. This has always meant that everyone turn towards Him in prayer, rather than that the priest face the people. In the final analysis, celebration *versus populum* is a turning towards man, and away from God.
