## ANNUAL FORTY HOURS DEVOTION NOVEMBER 3RD THROUGH 6TH

*Please see the enclosed schedule for Forty Hours Devotion, which will begin with the usual monthly Holy Hour held on the Thursday before 1st Friday. Adoration will not take place throughout the night. Sign up sheets with the times available for adoration on Friday, Saturday and Sunday will be posted in the rear of church and at the Parish Bazaar this Sunday. Please make time to come to church during these grace-filled days, for your intentions and growth in holiness, but especially out of thanksgiving to the Eucharistic Lord for His many blessings, especially the blessings of a good harvest.*

The practice of Forty Hours Devotion of Eucharistic Adoration originated in Milan about the year 1530, and symbolically was meant to commemorate the 40 hours the sacred Body of Our Lord rested in the sepulcher from Good Friday until Easter Sunday. In 1539, Pope Paul III responded to a petition from the Archdiocese of Milan asking for an indulgence for the practice: "Since our beloved son the Vicar General of the Archbishop of Milan, at the prayer of the inhabitants of the said city, in order to appease the anger of God provoked by the offenses of Christians, and in order to bring to naught the efforts and machinations of the Turks who are pressing forward to the destruction of Christendom, amongst other pious practices, has established a round of prayers and supplications to be offered by day and night by all the faithful of Christ, before our Lord's Most Sacred Body, in all the churches of the said city, in such a manner that these prayers and supplication are made by the faithful themselves relieving each other in relays for forty hours continuously in each church in succession, according to the order determined by the Vicar... We approving in our Lord so pious an institution, grant and remit." While this pronouncement seems to be the earliest official approval by the Church of this devotion, the Forty Hours Devotion spread rapidly. By 1550, both St. Philip Neri and St. Ignatius Loyola had also instituted this practice, especially in reparation for sin. In the late 1850's, the devotion was brought to the United States by St. John N. Neumann, the 4<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Philadelphia and first American male canonized Saint.

The Forty Hours Devotion is an opportunity to gather as a community before the Blessed Sacrament and to pray before the Lord in solemn adoration. It gives us time to deepen our appreciation of the importance of the mystery of the Holy Eucharist in our lives. In the celebration of the Forty Hours Devotion we are able to witness a fuller expression of our theology of the Eucharist. It is first and foremost about our participation in the Paschal Mystery through the celebration of the Holy Mass. In the celebration of Mass we participate directly in the saving acts of Christ and by the grace of the Holy Spirit unite the sacrifices of our lives with the one sacrifice of Christ on the cross. It is in this way that we give praise and thanksgiving to God for Jesus and participate in the true worship of our God by which we are sanctified as His holy people. This leads us then to live out our lives more fully in Christ. This devotion also gives an opportunity to give voice to our belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

**S**aint Mary Parish was founded, under the patronage of Mary, Help of Christians, in the Year of Our Lord 1885. The cornerstone of the second and current church was laid on July 4, 1898, with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass celebrated in it for the first time the following year. It was solemnly Consecrated according to the Roman Pontifical on June 18, 1907 by the 2nd Bishop of Sioux Falls, the Most Reverend Thomas O'Gorman. It was placed on the National Registry of Historic Places in 1985, the Centennial of the founding of the parish. On July 4, 2010, the parish celebrated its Quasquicentennial.

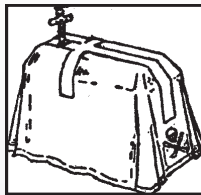

**WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 2nd, is the SOLEMN COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED, or ALL SOULS DAY:** While not a holyday of obligation, if at all possible Catholics should try to attend Holy Mass. Masses will be offered at 8:15am, 12noon and in the evening at 7:00pm (the Mass at Noon will the traditional Latin Mass). Following the 8:15am Mass, a visit to St. Mary's Cemetery will be made, prayers offered and graves blessed (at

**FROM THE HANDBOOK OF INDULGENCES:** Will you not, for love of your beloved deceased, try today to gain these indulgences for the Holy Souls in Purgatory?

**Visiting a Cemetery from November 1 through November 8:** A plenary ("full") indulgence, which is applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who *devoutly visit a cemetery or grave yard* during the former Octave of All Saints (November 1 through 8). The plenary indulgence may be gained each of the eight days. **Requirements for Obtaining a Plenary Indulgence from Nov. 1-8:**

- ✕ Devoutly visit a any cemetery and pray for the dead;
- ✕ Say one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the intentions of the Holy Father;
- ✕ Worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally the same day if you can get to Mass);
- ✕ Go to Confession within a week of (before or after) All Saints Day; and
- ✕ That one be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin.

**Visiting a Church or an Oratory on All Souls Day:** A plenary ("full") indulgence, which is applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly *visit a church or an oratory* on (November 2nd) All Souls Day. **Requirements for Obtaining a Plenary Indulgence on All Souls Day, November 2:**

- ✕ Visit a church or oratory and pray for souls in Purgatory;
- ✕ Say one "Our Father" and the "Creed" in the visit to the church;
- ✕ Say one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the intentions of the Holy Father;
- ✕ Worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally the same day if you can get to Mass);
- ✕ Go to Confession within a week (before or after) of All Souls Day; and
- ✕ That one be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin.

*Please note: only one plenary indulgence can be gained in a day.*

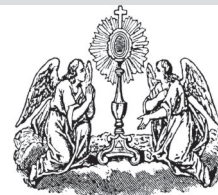
